

Hites Foundation Community College Transfer Scholarship

The Hites Foundation Community College Transfer Scholarship was established by the late Robert Hites, a former faculty member at the Meramec Campus of STLCC, and an executive at Ralston Purina. This scholarship is designed to assist students transferring from STLCC to an accredited four-year institution seeking a bachelor's degree.

Awarded students will receive a scholarship to their four-year institution of \$1,000 per semester, up to four semesters as long as they continue to meet scholarship requirements.

Eligibility

- Have at least 50 STLCC credit hours
- Have a 3.5 GPA and be in good standing
- Completed application and essay, "How St. Louis Community College has Prepared Me to Achieve My Academic and Career Goals." (500 word maximum.) Detail academic awards and community service activities
- STLCC students must provide documentation of acceptance to a bachelor's degree granting college **and** proof of current full-time enrollment schedule from your college or university

Student must use the award for the next regular semester (fall or spring). The award can be renewed for up to 2 years if the student attends full-time and maintains a 2.75 GPA.
