The transfer-out rates are based on data from the National Student Clearinghouse indicating students' enrollment at an institution subsequent to enrollment at STLCC within the same 150% time frame. Categories are mutually exclusive; that is, if a student graduated and then transferred, they are only counted as a graduate.
