

Community Health Worker Training

Community health workers are trusted members of the community they serve who assist individuals and communities to adopt healthy behaviors.

Community health workers may provide information on available resources, provide support and informal counseling, and be advocates for individuals and community health needs.

Learn to conduct outreach for medical personnel or health organizations to implement programs that promote, maintain and improve individual/community health.

Prerequisites:

- Must be 18 years of age.
- High school diploma or high school equivalent.
- Must be selected for the program.

Program Highlights:

- Classes start Thursday, July 26, 2018 and end Thursday, September 27, 2018.
- Ten (10) week programs combines 108 hybrid classroom hours with 60 service learning hours.
- Students meet Tuesdays and Thursdays from 8:30am – 12:30pm for classroom instruction.
- Classroom instruction is held at the William J. Harrison Education Center.
