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**Selective Admissions to Nursing Programs Prerequisites**

Rationale: Students who wish to declare a major in nursing programs must meet minimum criteria to apply. Admission to a program in the School of Health Professions is selective due to availability and limitations of practicum sites and limitations in the number of students who can be accommodated in clinical groups. All students interested in this program should consult a Student Success Advisor at their campus of their choice. The programs in the School of Health Professions require clinical or field experience as part of the curriculum. A criminal background check, drug screen, and documentation of current immunizations are required (at the student's expense) for participation in clinical or other field experiences. Specific academic criteria for admission are on the second page of this document.

**PROGRAM OF STUDY: Pre-Entry Course Requirements. Any additional prerequisite coursework required to complete pre-entry courses are not factored into total program hours.**

2	<b>Degree Seeking Status.</b> Official College Transcripts - An official transcript from each college attended must be sent directly from the college attended to the STLCC-Registrar's Office. 3	<b>Minimum cumulative GPA of 2.5.</b> <i>Developmental courses (numbered below 100) completed at any institution will not be counted toward the minimum cumulative GPA. The minimum 2.5 GPA must be maintained while on the Nursing Applicant List. A minimum GPA of 2.0 must be maintained once enrolled into the Nursing Program.</i> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>STLCC students with at least 15 college level credits with a 2.5 GPA will meet this requirement, regardless of the GPA at other colleges. College transfer students with fewer than 15 STLCC credits must have a cumulative 2.5 GPA in college level credits earned at all colleges attended.</li> </ul>	
4	<b>Math Proficiency</b> at or above the MTH 140 (Level 2) level. MTH 165 and MTH 166 will not meet the requirement for the nursing program. Please refer to the math proficiency chart for ways to meet this requirement. <b>Prerequisites:</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Reading Proficiency (MTH 140S)</li> <li>Satisfactory score on placement test and Reading Proficiency (MTH 140).</li> </ul>	
5	<b>Fundamentals of Chemistry: CHM 101 completed with a grade of "C" or higher OR two semesters of high school chemistry with a lab, both semesters completed with a grade of "C" or higher. Prerequisites:</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Completion of MTH 140S with a grade of "C" or higher or placement into MTH 140 or higher.</li> </ul>	
6	<b>Introductory Biology: BIO 111 completed with a grade of "C" or higher. BIO 111 prerequisites:</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Reading Proficiency or concurrent enrollment in RDG 079.</li> </ul>	
7	<b>College Composition I: ENG 101 completed with a grade of "C" or higher. Prerequisites:</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Satisfactory placement score on placement test.</li> <li>Completion of ENG 030 or ENG 070 with a grade of "C" or higher.</li> <li>Recommendation of department and Reading Proficiency.</li> <li>Concurrent enrollment in RDG 079.</li> </ul>

11	<b>Test of Essential Academic Skills (TEAS) exam completed with a minimum composite score of 58.7 within two calendar years of application.</b> Additional information: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Minimum of four weeks (30-days) between attempts in taking the TEAS exam and a maximum of three attempts in a 12-month period.</li> <li>TEAS exam can be completed in an STLCC testing center.</li> <li>Additional information and study guides can be found at <a href="http://www.atesting.com">www.atesting.com</a>.</li> </ul>	
12	<b>Standardized Testing Interview:</b> after completing the TEAS exam, the student is required to meet with a Nursing Retention Coach to discuss the results.

14	<b>General Microbiology I: BIO 203 completed with a grade of "C" or higher. Completed prior to NUR 170 or NUR 251. Prerequisites:</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>BIO 111 or BIO 140 completed with a grade of "C" or higher, or course equivalency.</li> <li>Reading Proficiency.</li> </ul>	
15	<b>Human Growth and Development: PSY 205 completed with a grade of "C" or higher. Completed prior to NUR 153 or NUR 170. Prerequisites:</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>PSY 200 completed with a grade of "C" or higher and Reading Proficiency.</li> </ul>	
<b>RN Bridge Additional Required Documentation:</b>		
16	<b>LPN / Paramedic License</b> - Current undisciplined copy of Missouri License (LPN or EMT-P). Full documented information can be found at either <a href="http://www.nursys.com">www.nursys.com</a> (LPN) or <a href="https://health.mo.gov/safety/ems/licenseesearch.php">https://health.mo.gov/safety/ems/licenseesearch.php</a> (EMT-P). Photos of physical licenses will not be accepted.	
17	<b>Work Experience</b> - One year of LPN or EMT-P work experience within five years of application. For students who have graduated within the past 12 months from an LPN or Paramedic program, the work experience requirement will be waived. Work experience must be attested to in a letter of reference. Resumes or CVs will not be accepted as proof of employment.	
18	<b>Letter of Reference</b> from recent or current employer.
